# **Program Notes**

#### Sugar Rush | Martin Blessinger

Sugar Rush was composed for Dr. Corey Mackey and the TCU Clarinet Studio on the occasion of their performance at the 2023 Midwest Clinic International Band, Orchestra, and Music Conference in Chicago, IL. The music is continuously energetic, jittery, and unfailingly sweet. (*Notes by the composer*)

#### Compass | Theresa Martin

Life often feels as if we are traveling at breakneck speeds, in desperate search of our own success, power, money, etc. Then we are suddenly faced with an unexpected storm, which can expose our vulnerability and make us feel afraid, hopeless, and uncertain. A compass helps to navigate uncharted waters. Being faced with a crisis can help us realize what is most important. It reminds us that we are all on this boat of life, and we are all perishing. We cannot go on thinking of ourselves. Only by rowing together can we ride through this storm. If we rely on faith, there will be no shipwreck. What is your compass? Compass was inspired by Pope Francis' "Urbi et Orbi" speech on Mar. 27, 2020, during the Global Pandemic of 2020. It was commissioned by the International Clarinet Association for President Mitchell Estrin. (*Notes by the composer*)

#### Dusk | Steven Bryant

This simple, chorale-like work captures the reflective calm of dusk, paradoxically illuminated by the fiery hues of sunset. I'm always struck by the dual nature of this experience, as if witnessing an event of epic proportions silently occurring in slow motion. *Dusk* is intended as a short, passionate evocation of this moment of dramatic stillness. *Dusk* is part of a threework "night cycle," continuing with The Marbled Midnight Mile and concluding with First Light.

The Clarinet version of *Dusk* was commissioned by the TCU Clarinet Ensemble, Dr. Corey Mackey, director and was premiered at the 2021 International Clarinet Association's *ClarinetFest* in Reno, Nevada. (*Notes by the composer*)

#### **On Being** | Brian Raphael Nabors

On Being for clarinet choir was commissioned by the Texas Christian University Clarinet Choir, under the direction of Dr. Corey Mackey. For many years I've been composing on themes of humanity, seeking to bring listeners into the fullness of themselves by trying to provide sonic spaces that enable them to receive what they need from music. My great hope is that it brings them into a space of fulfillment, peace, or rest. This work is yet another one of those contemplations, taking stock of where I am, and where we all are in our respective places in the world, seeking fulfillment, meaning, and rest. This ensemble is a unique one, in that the timbres provide a plethora of sonorities while also maintaining a sense of undeniable balance/congruency of sound. I'd like to compare it to our respective backgrounds, lifestyles, etc., all while possessing the unifying factor of our "human-ness." My hope is for listeners to feel an embodiment of that theme throughout the piece's varying emotional spaces. (*Notes by the composer*)

#### Burlesque | Adam Gorb

*Burlesque* for Clarinet Choir was commissioned by the British Clarinet Association. I was originally a not very good clarinetist, and my first attempt at an opus 1 was a suite for two clarinets written when I was thirteen in 1971. I thought it might be fun to revisit this very immature work, so the strident fanfares that open Burlesque are drawn from the opening of the juvenile suite. This acts as a curtain raiser to the main body of the piece, which highlight the more grotesque characteristics of the clarinet family including an abundance of grace notes, flutter tonguing and sounds influenced by the klezmer idiom. Violent outbursts alternate with passages of more joyous lyricism. There follows a more tranquil section drawn from the opening before a brief finale takes the piece into a more flowing sound world. At the very end a melody reminiscent of a Neapolitan folk song emerges, but ominous rumblings from the contrabass clarinet sound the warning that a more grotesque world isn't far away. (*Notes by the composer*)

#### Concertino, op. 26 | Carl Maria von Weber

Weber's Concertino, op. 26, was composed in 1811 for Heinrich Bearmann and was so successful that two subsequent concertos were written for the clarinet. These works are staples in the clarinet repertoire and established the reputation of the clarinet in the Romantic Era. It starts with a slow, dramatic introduction followed by a theme and variations. Today's performance with John Yeh would not be possible without the generous support of TCU, Yamaha, and Vandoren.

### **Musicians**

#### Dr. Corey Mackey, director



Dr. Corey Mackey enjoys a multi-faceted career as an educator, orchestral musician, soloist, and chamber musician. He is the Assistant Professor of Clarinet at Texas Christian University's School of Music.

Mackey maintains a bustling national presence, while international tours have taken him to Europe and China. He has appeared with Dallas Opera, Fort Worth Symphony Orchesrtra, Cincinnati-based ensemble concert:nova, Orchestra Iowa, Quad Cities Symphony, Cincinnati Chamber Orchestra, Flagstaff Symphony, Richmond Symphony (IN), and has performed and recorded an album with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra. During his tenure as Principal Clarinet of the Dubuque Symphony Orchestra (2009-2020) he appeared as a featured soloist in concertos by Mozart and Copland. A proponent of new music, Mackey has premiered and/or commissioned works by Paul Schoenfeld, Theresa Martin, Carter Pann, Libby Larsen, Adam Gorb,

Jim Stephenson, Till Meyn, William Neil, Chiayu Hsu, and Nathan Daughtrey. He is a founding member of the Mackey/Lienert Duo, a dynamic clarinet and percussion chamber ensemble whose debut album of new works for clarinet and percussion, *Escape*, was released in 2018 on the Mark Custom label.

An in-demand pedagogue, Dr. Mackey has presented masterclasses and guest recitals at universities across the country and in China. He has performed at several conferences, including the International Clarinet Association's *ClarinetFest*, The European Congress, The International Double Reed Society, International Tuba Euphonium Conference, National Flute Association, and the College Music Society's National Conference. Additional endeavors have included his appointment as Artistic Director of the Mineral Point Chamber Music Festival (WI), Founder and Artistic Director of the Blue Dish Music Festival, ICA Wisconsin State Chair, and host of the Dubuque Symphony Orchestra's Gen S community outreach events. He has appeared as a guest artist several times on Wisconsin Public Radio's All Classical Network and WDRT's "Symphony Sunday" program.

Dr. Mackey holds a D.M.A. from the College-Conservatory of Music, University of Cincinnati, M.M. from the University of Minnesota – Twin Cities, and B.M. in Music Education and Performance from Northern Arizona University. His principal teachers include Burt Hara, Richie Hawley, Jonathan Gunn, Jeremy Reynolds, and Michael Sullivan.

John Bruce Yeh joined the Chicago Symphony Orchestra in 1977 as bass clarinet by Georg Solti at the age of 19, the first Asian musician ever appointed to the CSO. Two years later, he was named assistant principal and E-flat clarinet. The longest-serving clarinetist in CSO history, he also served as acting principal clarinet from 2008 to 2011. He has performed as guest principal of the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Seoul Philharmonic in Korea, and the Guangzhou Symphony in China. He was a prizewinner at both the 1982 Munich International Music Competition and the 1985 Naumburg Clarinet Competition in New York. Yeh has performed as a soloist with the CSO several times, including in Carl Nielsen's Clarinet Concerto with Neeme Järvi and in the U.S. premiere of Elliott Carter's Clarinet Concerto with Pierre Boulez. He continues to solo with orchestras around An enthusiastic champion of new music, Yeh is the dedicatee of new works for clarinet by numerous composers, ranging from Ralph Shapey to John Williams. He appears at festivals and on chamber music series worldwide, including the Marlboro Music Festival, Taipei Music Academy Festival and the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center. Yeh has performed with the Guarneri, Ying, Colorado, Calder and Pacifica string quartets, among others. His more than a dozen solo and chamber music recordings have earned worldwide critical acclaim, including the 2007 release for Naxos entitled *Synergy* of single and double concertos with clarinet featuring Yeh, his wife Teresa Reilly, and his daughter Molly Yeh.

John Bruce Yeh is director and cofounder of Chicago Pro Musica, which received the 1985 Grammy Award for Best New Classical Artist. With clarinetist Teresa Reilly, erhu virtuoso Wang Guowei and pipa virtuoso Yang Wei, Yeh formed Birds and Phoenix, an innovative quartet dedicated to musical exploration by bridging Eastern and Western musical cultures.

Yeh is on the artist-faculties of Roosevelt University's Chicago College for the Performing Arts and Midwest Young Artists in Fort Sheridan, Illinois. He is the proud father of Jenna Yeh, culinary artist and wine specialist in Chicago; Molly Yeh, percussionist and Food Network TV personality in Minnesota; and multitalented teenager Mia Reilly-Yeh.



#### Bobby Francis, guest conductor



**Bobby R. Francis** is a Professor and Director of Bands at Texas Christian University. Mr. Francis serves as Conductor of the TCU Wind Symphony, teaches graduate and undergraduate conducting, and is responsible for the supervision of all aspects of the TCU Band and Wind Conducting programs. Mr. Francis is an elected member of the American Bandmasters Association (ABA). He currently serves the organization as President-Elect and will assume the Presidency in February 2024. Previously, Prof. Francis served on the Sousa-ABA- Ostwald Award Selection Committee that selects the outstanding new composition for Wind Band each year – the most significant award a composer for the wind band medium can receive. He also served as a member of the ABA Board of Directors for many years. He is a Past-President of the CBDNA Southwest Region and the Big 12 Band Directors Association. His former directors include Norman White (Junior High), Tom Neugent (High School) and James Keene (College).

Guest conducting appearances include the U.S. Marine Band "President's Own", U.S. Army Band "The Pershing's Own," Frost School of Music – University of Miami Wind Symphony, The U.S. Coast Guard Band, the Lone Star Youth Wind Orchestra among others. The TCU Wind Symphony has performed with guest artists including the Jens Lindemann, Demondrae Thurman, American Brass Quintet, Sam Palafian, Patrick Sheridan, Brian Bowman, Allen Vizzutti, Jon Lewis, Joe Eckert, Corey Mackey, Clay Garrett, Gary Whitman, Jesus Castro- Balbi, Brian West, Shauna Thompson, Markus Theinert and Boston Brass.

Mr. Francis has collaborated with many composers including Paul Dooley, John Mackey, Frank Ticheli, David Maslanka, Michael Colgrass, Curt Wilson, Joseph Turrin, James Syler, James Stephenson, Kevin Day, Eric Ewazen, Michael Daugherty, Quinn Mason, Onsby Rose, Blaise Ferrandino, Till Meyn, Haley Woodrow, Shuying Li and John Corigliano. In recent years, the TCU Wind Symphony has accepted invitations to perform at the 2018 Convention of the American Bandmasters Association (ABA) annual convention with guest artists the "Boston Brass", the 2019 at the College Band Directors National Association Convention (CBDNA) in Tempe Arizona with guest artist Demondrae Thurman, the 2020 Texas Music Educators Association Convention (TMEA) in San Antonio with guest artist Jens Lindemann and will be hosting and have accepted an invitation to perform at the 2025 convention of the CBDNA - at the new TCU Music Center in the Van Cliburn Concert Hall. The TCU Wind Symphony was also invited to perform at the recent convention of the World Association of Symphonic Winds and Ensembles (WASBE) in Prague, Czech Republic. The group had to decline due to TCU's covid restrictions for international travel.

He has conducted concerts in the Sydney Opera House, Carnegie Hall, Morton H. Meyerson Symphony Center (Dallas), Bass Performance Hall (Fort Worth), Royal College of Music (London), Lila Cockrell Theater (San Antonio), University of Michigan (Ann Arbor), Tempe Center for the Performing Arts (Tempe, Arizona), Normandy Beach (France), Pearl Harbor (Hawaii) and many locations in Italy, France, Austria, and Germany.



The **TCU Clarinet Ensemble** is comprised of graduate and undergraduate students from Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas. Established in 2021 by Dr. Corey Mackey, this ensemble seeks out exciting arrangements, old favorites, and new commissions for clarinet ensemble.
